# **Special Worship for October and November**

**October** brings us two very special church celebrations, World Communion, and Reformation Sundays. Both, remind us of our connectedness with Christians around the world. No matter who we are or where we live, God's love and grace reaches out and makes a difference in our lives. **Dinner Church** will return, **Wednesday**, **October 4**<sup>th</sup> **at 6PM**. We will host Dinner Church each first Wednesday of the month. The next offer will be Wednesday, November 6<sup>th</sup>. Join us for this time of Potluck food, fellowship and faith!

October 1, 2023, is World Communion Sunday. Traditionally, this worship offers congregations a distinctive opportunity to experience Holy Communion in the context of the global community of faith. The first Sunday of October has become a time when Christians in every culture break bread and pour the cup to remember and affirm Christ as the Head of the Church. On that day, they remember that they are part of the whole body of believers. Whether shared in a grand cathedral, a mud hut, outside on a hilltop, in a meetinghouse, or in a storefront, Christians celebrate the communion liturgy in as many ways as there are congregations. World Communion Sunday can be both a profound worship experience and a time for learning more about our wider community of faith.

**Sunday, October 29**<sup>th</sup> is Reformation Sunday! Throughout the year we preach about many things in church. About how we live our daily lives, the choices we make, the habits of our faith. On Reformation Sunday we are brought back to the most important thing – the thing that compelled Martian Luther and others to risk their lives. In our worship we are invited to return to the core of our faith:

God loved us first, and God continues to shower us with grace and mercy.

**November** always begins with our celebration of the Saints who have died over the past year. We will light candles and ring the singing bowl as each name is read. We will also celebration around the Communion Table. Please join us for **All Saints Day, Sunday, November 5<sup>th</sup>**. It is a One Service Sunday at 10:30AM. # Property Committee Update October, 2023

Our property projects are progressing. There are just a few items to complete before the Parsonage bathroom is complete. It's been a long journey, but we are near the end!

Other projects that will be completed this fall and winter are as follows:

- Replacement of the parsonage windows
- Repair and wrapping of the window sills in Fellowship Hall
- Repair of the round window at the UUG church
- Replacement of the front door at the UUG church (this is a safety concern)

In addition, we are working at replacing light bulbs in the sanctuary with LED lights. Hopefully, this will result in lower electric bills and less frequent replacement of the bulbs.

Routine maintenance projects that have been completed are cleaning the carpets in the sanctuary, gathering area and administrative area. We plan to clean the carpets annually and the upholstered furniture every other year. Regular cleaning should lengthen the life of these items.

Bruce has replaced the wooden blocks with door stops to hold doors open. This eliminates the need for searching for the blocks as well as replacing the door apparatus on one of the doors leading into the sanctuary.

The next major project is repair of some masonry joints on certain areas of the historic part of our building as well as sealing those bricks. That project will need to wait until additional funds are raised.

Heartfelt thanks for those who have contributed to the Capital Campaign. These funds will enable us to get Trinity shipshape and eliminate the need for major repairs in the foreseeable future (barring disasters, of course).

Thanks to everyone who helped with Polish Potter bingo – especially Tim and Becky Woodward who lent their expertise and donated the prize pottery. It was great fun!

The Open and Affirming Process Committee is working diligently to provide appropriate educational opportunities in the upcoming months.

On the calendar thus far:

**Sunday, October 8th at 9:00am** - "What is a covenant?" by Pastor Fred (approximately 30 minutes - Adult Sunday School to follow as time allows)

Sunday, October 22nd at 9:00am - "St. James Lutheran Church's experience in becoming 'Reconciling in Christ'; before and after."

**Sunday, November 5th at 9:00am** - Dr. Julia O'Brien, Professor of Hebrew Bible/Old Testament and Director of the Master of Arts in Ministry and Leadership Program at Lancaster Theological Seminary. (Topic still being determined.)

All of the above sessions will be held in the Fellowship Hall and are expected to last between 30 and 60 minutes. Speakers are offered 9:00am or 11:30am time slots, which are chosen based upon the speakers' availability and the availability of the Fellowship Hall. Session for congregation discussion will be offered.

# What's going on with RRP? Probably more than you can digest! Let's start with spring of 2023:

We had two graduates from Gettysburg high school . Our career options team had been working with both upcoming graduates to secure a future in line with their hopes and expectations. The oldest son was interested in a good paying job with a future. After exploring career link, HACC, and other options, our team members located a local executive with contacts in several areas. He met the family and was impressed with the eldest son. He is now working full-time as a Carpenter trainee and earning a good income.

The second oldest son, who also graduated, had been interested in going to college ever since he arrived. The first words of import that he spoke while sitting on the newly placed couch in the newly acquired rental house, were that he was hoping that he would have a chance to go to college and was wondering if there might be some way we could assist him. Our team members went to work and assisted this young man with every aspect of college application, writing essays, applying for scholarships, filling out paperwork and visiting campuses galore. Then, a tutor was found for the summer to help him polish his writing skills.

The final result was a generous financial package that allowed him to attend Elizabethtown college. He is extremely happy and has made several friends and joined the lifting team! He is impressed with the availability of prepared food whenever he visits the dining hall, and the opportunity to have a schedule that includes studying, exercising, visiting professors during office hours to clarify his studies, and hanging around with other kids. He said he is very happy.

Though mothers with young children sometimes take a backseat when it comes to career development, recent events have paved the way for one mom to acquire a Serv-safe certificate, and she is hoping to prepare her Afghan bread, or naan, in a certified kitchen for sale to the public. The other mom is interested in setting up an alterations business. They are receiving assistance on both fronts.

Racing events have been popular, with the Highmark Wholecare Memorial Day Free 5K and Labor Day Free 5K, both sponsored by Healthy Adams County: The father in our 2<sup>nd</sup> family (Ahmadzai) ran the Memorial Day event, and rated well in his age group, while the Labor Day run resulted in 3 of our first family (Nasiri) placing in the first 6 finishers. They took 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> place out of about 200 runners, with the father finishing the race in good standing for his age group, as well! Meanwhile the youngest 3 Nasiri's have done some fun runs weekly for a month in the spring and in September, with several wins to their credit!

Both families are finding ways to connect with others, through worship opportunities closer to home, and through team soccer for adults, and English classes at the college. Children continue to do well in school, and generally life is good in these United States. Our families say that Gettysburg is a good place, with good people. They love the green-ness of our surroundings and compare them to other places with more brown in the landscape. For them, the grass is greener on THIS side of the fence!


