Be a February Food Banker!! Trinity is coming together in February to collect and supply NON - PERISHABLE FOOD PRODUCTS for our local Food Pantry: SCCAP (South Central Community Action Program.) Starting the first day of February through the last day of February, you will find a table set up in the Gathering Area, as well as a grocery cart in the main entrance on High Street. The cart (compliment of Kennies) makes it convenient for those who do not want to carry food up the stairs. Bring food to Sunday services or during the week.

<u>DID YOU KNOW?</u>: In Adams County alone in 2022, 42% of the total student enrollment qualified for Free/Reduced Lunches. There were 15,744 meals served at the Soup Kitchen and 8359 residents were enrolled in the SNAP program (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program.) All indicators are these number will increase when compilations are completed for 2023. That's a lot of children, seniors, and families going to bed hungry each night. There is an alarming gap in the amount of income (usually by a very small margin) that prevents families from qualifying for Federal and State Programs that offer food assistance. The gap needs to be filled. <u>We ask ourselves "What would Jesus do?"</u> He would become a FEBRUARY FOOD BANKER and feed those less fortunate. We've got this Trinity!! Let's do it!! THANK YOU!

### Members of Trinity UCC,

This letter is to thank each and everyone who donated generously to Trinity's Capital Campaign for Building Projects. In a June 14, 2023 letter, Trinity announced the Capital Campaign to raise \$137,000 in 6 months to support the 5-year property plan approved by the congregation.

## At the end of 2023, your donations have raised almost \$110,000!

Your very generous support allowed the Property Committee to complete or start many of our needed capital building projects, including:

- Parsonage bathroom renovation completed
- Bricks repair and sealing scheduled to start in appropriate weather
- Repair of round window at UUG will be reinstalled when temperatures allow
- UUG Front Doors in progress
- Parsonage front windows ordered and will be installed when they arrive
- Parsonage front porch columns currently waiting an updated price

There have been project cost increases this past year that have not allowed Trinity to start two projects (exterior painting and Stratton Street building roof) as yet. The Finance Committee will continue to monitor campaign commitments/pledges and other funds as they become available for these needed projects.
