



"Tuesdays with Morrie" will be playing at the Totem Pole July 21st. There is a signup sheet on the table at the back of the Gathering Area. We need to have at least 10 members for a group rate. We are hoping for many more. We've already paid the \$200 deposit to save our seats. A description of the show from Totem Pole's website follows: Based on the 1997 New York Times bestseller by Mitch Albom that sold over 20 million copies, "Tuesdays with Morrie" is the autobiographical story of an accomplished sports journalist driven solely by his career, and Morrie Schwartz, his former college professor. Sixteen years after graduation, Mitch happens to catch Morrie's appearance on Nightline, a television news program and learns that his old professor is battling ALS. Mitch is reunited with Morrie and what starts as a simple visit turns into a weekly pilgrimage and a last class in the in the meaning of life.

### Results of the Open and Affirming (ONA) Covenant Vote

A ballot was mailed to each member of Trinity in early March. 104 were returned by the end of Easter Sunday worship services and tabulated by volunteers at the Penn Central Conference.

They report:

79 ballots were marked "Yes". (76%)

25 ballots were marked "No". (24%)

The ONA Process Committee and Consistory had decided that we needed to achieve 80% positive responses in order to consider the covenant accepted.

Although the majority voted to accept the covenant, we did not achieve the established percentage. Therefore, we will not be considered an Open and Affirming Church within the United Church of Christ at this time.

I would like to thank the members of the Open and Affirming Process Committee for their diligent work over the past year: Sandy Busche, Jane Eiker, Lucy Greene, Cathy Hammons, and Roberta Weiant.

I'd also like to thank the many members of our congregation who attended the education and discussion sessions, as well as the presenters, participants, and mediators.



There is some good news from the Property Committee. First of all, Bruce has finished matching the various switches and electrical outlets with the appropriate breaker box. It was an enormous undertaking, but Bruce stuck with it and completed the work. You will notice labels on each receptacle and switch delineating which breaker controls its power. Thank you, Bruce!

The windows in the parsonage have been replaced. Pastor Fred and Kara now have windows with screens that can actually be opened and closed. These windows are energy efficient and are no longer covered with storm windows which improves the parsonage's façade. We seem to grind along slowly, we are moving forward.

The round window in the UUG church will be re-installed as soon as temperatures are reliably in the 70's. The replacement of the front door will follow shortly. Bill Jacobs is working on the preparation work for that now.

The remaining project is sealing and repairing our historic brick. That has been scheduled, and we are waiting appropriate weather.

A big thank you to Harry Hilbert and Steve Sheely for working on the chairs in the sanctuary. They will replace the plywood seats and foam, making the chairs much more comfortable. The choir will be particularly grateful for the repairs. The cost to repair each chair is \$5.50. There are 43 chairs. If you'd like to donate some money toward completing this project, please label your notation "chair fund". Many thanks for any help you can offer.
